East Navajo Court & West Navajo Court Cul-de-sacs have been the topic of discussion with recent City Council Meetings. Proposed Plan was to remove the islands and pave over the land. This would eliminate the green space including trees and shrubs along with moving the fire hydrants. Local Residents voiced their concerns of this drastic change and asked alternative solutions to repair the routine damage from trucks moving through this area.
